Ralph grew up mostly in Media, PA, and could hear the West Chester local going by his home. THURSDAY is the BIG DAY at the STRASBURG RAILROAD, THE RAILROAD MUSEUM OF PA AND THE NATIONAL TOY TRAIN MUSEUM where special events have been arranged for members of the PRRT&HS throughout the day before the evening presentations begin at the hotel. Here is a sampling of what you will experience:

#### "STRASBURG RAILROAD BACKSHOP TOUR"

The Strasburg Railroad is offering on Thursday May 16<sup>th</sup> exclusively to all PRR T&HS members *special back shop tours* of their restoration facilities. The Strasburg Railroad has one of the BEST steam restoration facilities in the country. Railroads like the Colorado and Southern RR and Walt Disney World RR have their engines restored here. For every member that takes the tour, \$5.00 will go to the *fully operating* restoration of the Long Island (PRR) G5s #39. For every member that takes the tour/ride combination, \$10.00 will be donated to the restoration. Backshop tours will run from 11 AM hourly in three groups of 25 for each hourly tour. You will be assigned a time as the registration forms are received. First come, first served basis. The RR will offer as many tours as needed to accommodate all of our Annual Meeting attendees. The combination ticket will include unlimited train rides all day Thursday. The trains run at 12,1,2 and 3 PM.

#### SPECIALTRAIN DISPLAY

<u>TENTATIVELY</u> SCHEDULED, the Strasburg Railroad has authorized the PRR E8 equipment of Bennett Levin to occupy trackage on the railroad for the weekend beginning on Thursday morning May 16<sup>th</sup>. ## "RAILROAD MUSEUM OF PA - SUPER PENNSY DAYS"

Special exhibits and presentations will be available at the Museum all day and throughout the weekend celebrating the history of the PRR.
